Here at CDA, we want to ensure that we align ourselves with God. The focus of these ten days is clarity and vision; believing God to bring direction, unity, and fresh insight for our lives and for our church. As we pray and fast together, let's ask the Lord to guide us and show us what's next.

10 Days of Fasting & Prayer for Vision and Clarity

“The fast you choose today determines the clarity you walk in tomorrow.” - unknown author

Day 1 – Consecration: Setting Our Hearts Before God

Scripture: Romans 12:1–2

“Present your bodies as a living sacrifice...be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”

Devotion:

Before God gives us a vision, He calls for consecration on our behalf. In order to get a hold of God’s vision, our whole being must be aligned with Him. Once we surrender to him, then clarity will flow. As a church, we at CDA start this fast by laying ourselves on the altar, asking God to renew our thinking and realign our priorities.

Prayer:

Lord, we present ourselves to You. Cleanse our hearts, renew our minds, and remove anything that clouds our ability to hear Your voice. Prepare us to receive Your vision. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Day 2 – Repentance: Removing Spiritual Blind Spots

Scripture: Psalm 51:10–12

“Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.”

Devotion:

Sin dulls spiritual vision. It makes our world foggy. Repentance makes way for us to be able to see clearly. Today, we ask God to reveal our blind spots, both personal and as a church, that may block us from experiencing clarity. A clean heart creates a clear pathway for God’s direction for our lives.

Prayer:

Father, search us and know us. Forgive us for attitudes, actions, or distractions that have hindered Your work. Cleanse our hearts and restore spiritual sensitivity. Amen.

Day 3 – Hearing God’s Voice



Scripture: John 10:27

“My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me.”

Devotion:

God is always speaking; the challenge is learning to listen. Fasting quiets competing voices so we can clearly hear His voice. Fasting allows us to experience intimacy with God.

Prayer:

Lord, quiet every competing voice. Tune our ears to hear You clearly. Teach us to discern Your voice above all others. We choose to follow You. Amen.

Day 4 – Vision for God’s Kingdom

Scripture: Matthew 6:33

“Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness...”

Devotion:

Church vision or our own vision for our life must never replace Kingdom vision. Today, we ask God to align us with His eternal purposes. When we seek the Kingdom first, clarity follows.

Prayer:

God, align our church with Your Kingdom agenda. Remove all selfish ambition and replace it with Kingdom passion. Let our vision reflect heaven’s priorities. Amen.

Day 5 – Unity in Vision

Scripture: Amos 3:3

“Can two walk together unless they are agreed?”

Devotion:

Vision thrives in unity. Division blurs direction. Today, we pray for oneness among leadership, teams, and the congregation. When hearts align, momentum increases.

Prayer:

Father, unify our church around Your vision. Heal divisions, strengthen relationships, and create agreement in spirit and purpose. Let us move forward together. Amen.

Day 6 – Faith to See What God Is Revealing



Scripture: Hebrews 11:1

“Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.”

Devotion:

Vision often requires faith before evidence. God may show us what doesn't yet exist. Today, we ask for faith to believe what He reveals, even when it stretches us.

Prayer:

Lord, increase our faith. Help us see beyond our limitations and trust what You are revealing. Give us the courage to believe big and walk boldly. Amen.

Day 7 – Strategy and Wisdom

Scripture: Proverbs 16:3

“Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.”

Devotion:

Vision without strategy remains a dream. God not only reveals direction but also wisdom for execution. Today, we pray for divine strategy for growth, outreach, and discipleship.

Prayer:

God, establish our plans as we commit them to You. Release wisdom, creativity, and practical strategy for fulfilling Your vision. Order our steps. Amen.

Day 8 – Compassion for the Harvest

Scripture: Matthew 9:36–38

“He had compassion on them... The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.”

Devotion:

Vision is fueled by compassion. When we see people the way Jesus sees them, mission becomes urgent. Today, we ask God to break our hearts for our city and beyond.

Prayer:

Jesus, give us Your compassion for the lost and the broken. Let our vision be driven by love, not numbers. Send us into the harvest. Amen.

Day 9 – Empowerment of the Holy Spirit



Scripture: Acts 1:8

“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you...”

Devotion:

Vision requires power. Human effort alone cannot fulfill divine purpose. Today, we pray for fresh empowerment, boldness, and anointing from the Holy Spirit.

Prayer:

Holy Spirit, fill us afresh. Empower our church to walk in boldness, clarity, and spiritual authority. Let Your power accompany the vision You give. Amen.

Day 10 – Commitment to Obedience

Scripture: Habakkuk 2:2–3

“Write the vision and make it plain...”

Devotion:

Clarity leads to responsibility. Today, we commit not just to see the vision, but to obey it. We will see God honor us as we move into action.

Prayer:

Lord, we commit to obey what You have revealed. Help us write the vision, walk it out, and trust You for the results. May Your Kingdom come through us. In Jesus' name, Amen.
